

PAVING PROJECT FORCES WATER ADJUSTMENTS

Beginning Friday, May 21, a contractor will begin repairing asphalt on the Maple Ridge Creek Village walking path. The contractor has asked that the sprinkling systems near the path be turned off until the project is over, which hopefully will be Tuesday, May 24. Why? Heavy equipment will be brought in and the contractor asked the grounds be as solid and dry as possible.

Here are the areas that will be affected by the watering shutoff:

- 1) The area around the Washington Road entrance and exit.
- 2) The west side of Boulder Court and the two units on Dunham near Washington Rd.
- 3) The north side of Maple Creek Court, because part of that systems waters the path
- 4) The south side of Dunham, as the path runs from the retention pond to the Washington Road exit.

The rest of the grounds (the east side of Boulder, the north side of Dunham and the east side of Maple Creek Court) will be watered as usual.

If possible, we will try to turn on portion of the systems---front of the units---that the equipment will not be on by Saturday, given the high temperatures.

Everything will be back to normal by Wednesday, barring complications.
